**Gospel Reflection**

**A Word of Hope**

Dn 12:1-3; Heb 10:11-14.18; Mk 13:24-32

Whenever I read this sort of passage, I am taken back to my childhood when we had those fire and brimstone preachers at parish missions. If they could get enough fear into people, then they would feel they had succeeded. More people would be saved. But now I wonder what all that fear was about. After all, the phrase 'Do not be afraid' is the most common one used in the whole Bible. So what is Jesus saying to us in this passage from Mark's Gospel? What is the Good News here?



To understand this passage, we must see it in the context of the whole chapter. The disciples were admiring the temple structure. In response, Jesus announced that this temple would be destroyed. His disciples asked when this would happen and for some sign. Jesus was a sign of contradiction. His followers will also be signs of contradiction. The temple represents the power of the privileged of his time. They rejected the proclamation of the kingdom and sought to kill Jesus. They wanted to eradicate his memory. But they would not succeed. The Lord will come in power and majesty. His message will never be forgotten.

This temple message is permanent. The Jewish people thought they had all the truth. They put their trust in a building. As Catholics, we too claim that we have the truth and we too often put our trust in physical objects like our churches or even our Mass times. Jesus is the only temple that we can put our trust in. His message is liberating because it calls us to serve rather than to dominate. The destruction of the temple is not the end of history. It is an event that points to a more certain way of reaching God and proclaiming his kingdom.

There will be hard times. We must put away our impulse to make ourselves into a 'temple' of privileges and pride. Then we will be ready to welcome God's healing friendship. God will lift us up from the dust of the earth. We are to be people of hope reading the signs of the times. "My words will not pass away."

**The Statue of the Sacred Heart and Flinders Park Foundation Stones**

**The Statue**

According to anecdotal reports the Statue was originally positioned somewhere in the middle of the current car park. The Statue was then moved to the position directly in front of the Presbytery. It is not clear when this happened but the inscription on the pedestal refers to Silver Jubilee 1914-1939. Around 2010 or 2011, the Statue was completely destroyed by vandals. To replace it a new one was acquired from Italy. Although impressive aesthetically, it is not a replica of the original. This one too was vandalised in subsequent years although not totally destroyed like the original. With the advent of a new rental arrangement for the Presbytery, it became necessary to move the statue to its present position in front of the western side of the church. It looks beautiful as it stands embracing all who arrive at the car park. We pray that with God's blessing it will be free of future acts of vandalism.



**Flinders Park Foundation Stones**

The Flinders Park Foundation Stones now embedded in the church immediately behind the Sacred Heart Statue, stands as a monument to the rich history of the Flinders Park Catholic Community and the humble beginnings of the church in which the Foundation Stones were originally emplaced. The Foundation Stone of the Church/Hall of St Columban's, as it was known, was laid by Archbishop Spence in 1929. As new families moved into the area in the post-war period, it was decided the Church/Hall had to be extended and provisions be made for its use by the school. The Church was given the title St Joseph's in 1949. The blessing and opening of the additions were carried out by Bishop Beovich in 1953. Over the years the church would serve as a school hall and church according to the needs of the moment. After many years in which the church had served the community so well, the difficult decision was made to close the building and for the community to be relocated to Findon. *Your brother in Christ, Fr Bill Brady, msc*

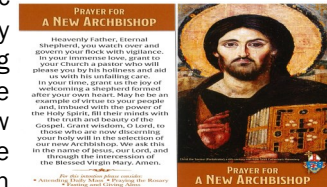

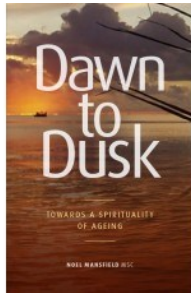
